

**ANNUAL BOARD MEETING
ELECTORATE MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS**

**Town of Buffalo
April 17, 2013**

Electors Comments or Concerns *Electors were leaving.*

- A. Bob Brockway, seconded by John Nindorf, made a motion as a directive to the Town Board against the 45 mph Town speed limit and spending the money to install signs. Discussion followed for and against. Further costs estimates for signs will be obtained.
- B. Margarete Worthington, seconded by Charles Church, introduced the following resolution: **The Buffalo Town electorate directs the Buffalo Town Board to appropriate money to enhance citizen's civic knowledge and participation in local government activities by funding a Web Master for the town website. Funding to purchase of up to 5 hours per month from a qualified person whose responsibilities would include timely posting in all the categories as they are currently presented on the existing website.** Yes – 33; No – 2; Abstain – 1.
- C. Gordon Bentley, seconded by Gary Bluhm, introduced the following resolution: **The Buffalo Town electorate directs the Buffalo Town Board to exercise zoning authority and rigorously apply the processes set forth in Zoning Board Handbook, University of WI Steven's Point, and the Center for Land Use Education and shared by Tom Onofrey at the Board and Land Use Plan Committee formal training given in March of 2013.** Yes – 26; No – 0; Abstain – 10.
- D. Alma Paul thanked Fred Wollenburg for all the work and time he has spent as Town Chairman.
- E. David Rieckmann, seconded by Gordon Bentley, introduced the following resolution: **The Buffalo Town electorate directs the Buffalo Town Board to continue to support the work of the Land Use Planning Committee but limit the participation of Board Members to one (1) Board member and appoint a citizen to the vacated spot. This was recommended by Tom Onofrey to reduce the possibility of conflict of interest in recommendations and guidance given to the Board by this committee.** Yes – 36; No – 0; Abstain – 0.
- F. Tiffany Lodholz, seconded by Gene Mucciolo, introduced the following resolution: **The Buffalo Town electorate directs the Buffalo Town Board to engage in watershed protection, soil conservation or water conservation activities beneficial to the town's adequate provision of quantity and quality of water in lakes, streams, and private wells.** Yes – 32; No – 0; Abstain – 4.
