Agenda

Jan Banicki, second by Mary-Anne Raab, made a motion to approve the agenda as read. Motion carried.

Minutes

Update on 16th Road Bridge

Update on Buggy Signs

The DOT will be installing three horse and buggy signs on Highway 22.

Implement of Husbandry Laws Act 377 (IOH)

The State offers six options for the towns to choose from to comply with the law. The County has chosen Option F. Option F does not require us to post new signs that would cost \$2177.00. The options were reviewed and discussion followed. The Town Chairman has asked the County for a split of the permit monies collected in the Town of Buffalo. This will be discussed at the next County Board meeting. Mary-Anne Raab, second by Jan Banicki, made a motion to approve Option F. Motion carried. The County and DOT will be notified of the Town’s choice.

Correspondence

The correspondence was reviewed.

Citizen and Board Concerns

- A. Fred Wollenburg asked that the Town look at the truck traffic on 16th Court. The semi trucks are using 16th Court as a short cut to Hwy 22. The Town could impose a 40% weight reduction as was done on 17th Road.

The vouchers were presented and discussed. Mary-Anne Raab, second by Jan Banicki, made a motion to approve payment of the vouchers. Motion carried.
